3 "P"s – The Gifts: Peace,Power,Purpose Kimo Ho'opai, April 11, 2021

And what we see is that in this first appearance to the disciples he says three things. And these three things turn out to be three gifts to you: the gift of peace, the gift of power, and the gift of purpose.

The opposite of peace is conflict. The opposite of power is weakness. The opposite of purpose is aimlessness. Many, many lives are ruined by conflict, weakness, and aimlessness. Jesus did not come into the world and die and rise again to ruin your life. But to save it. And what we will see is that he saves us from ruining our lives by becoming himself in our peace and our power and our purpose.

1.Gift of Peace John 20:19 NIV On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!"

John 14:27 NIV Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.
